Meeting notes

The meeting was opened by Freddy Tshiala Milambo. He welcomed Thokozani Masilela, the official from Rand Water. He welcomed the attendants and introduced the ward councillors present in the meeting Mr Peter Stewart and Mr Lucky chabalala. Freddy Tshiala introduced himself as the Environmental Assessment Practitioner.

Freddy had a talk of the proposed Q6 pipeline project, the Basic Assessment process and the Water Use Licence Application process as well as the progress up to date of the proposed Q6 pipeline project. Thokozani Masilela answered the questions which related to the impact of the Q6 Pipeline and emphasise

there are two pipeline involved of which one is the Q6 pipeline from the Rand Water Eikenho Pumping Station to the Meredale Reservoir, which triggers and Basic Assesment Application for an Environmental Authourisation. He futher indicated that the other pipe;line will be called the G38 pipeline from the Meredale Reservoir to Baragwanath, which do not trigger any listing notices in tems of NEMA, but Rand Water felt the need to inform the public about the G38 as well.. He also answered the communities concerns while Freddy focused more on the environmental aspects. The Power Point Presentation outlined the following points:

Mr Thokozani assisted Freddy Tshiala to distribute the comments sheets to everyone who was present at the meeting and the attendance register was circulated to everyone who attended the meeting to fill in and sign

After the presentation Freddy Tshiala Milambo opened the floor for any questions that the community had regarding the project.

Attendees raised the following issues outlined in table 1 below:

How will the community benefit from the proposed project?	Answer from EAP: the communities will benefit because Rand Water is increasing the pipes size to supply water all over

Question/ Comment	Response
	Ormonde view and Meredale areas and also on the fact that there is a lot of developments taking place in and around Ormonde view and Meredale area.
Question/ Comment	Response
Will the proposed project create job opportunities for the communities?	Answer from the Rand Water Official: Yes jobs will be created but Rand Water will not be employing any one and there are not involved on that process at all. Community employment will be done through the councillor together with the contractor and the community liaising Officer.
Question/ Comment	Response
Councillor Peter Stewart emphasise that his role in the project will be to sit in the meetings to make sure that the project runs smoothly. Also to sit with the contractor and the CLO to make sure that the contractor create jobs opportunities for the communities. The councillor will ask the communities to submit their CVs to the contractor and probably more or less 3 for the CLO appointment for this project.	Noted.

What is the meaning of CLO?	Answer from the Rand Water Official: If Community Liaison Officer. He is the guy who will represent the communities

Question/ Comment	Answer from the Rand Water official:
How many people will get employed for this project?	The numbers of people to get job during the phase of construction that will depend to the contractor.
Which direction the Q6 pipeline will take?	Answer from Rand Water official: The proposed Q6 pipeline will go through the existing Rand Water servitude.
Question/ Comment	Response
will the contractor cut the grass /or clean the areas during the construction?	Answer from Rand Water official: There are appropriate people assign for that, but we will take note of that.
Question/ Comment	Response
How could we submit the comments sheets?	Answer from EAP (Freddy): Email is the best and easy way to submit the comment sheets.
Question/ Comment	Response
Is it possible that the pipelines be constructed at the same time with the New Meredale reservoir?	Answer from Rand Water official: Yes the pipeline will be constructed while there are also busy with the reservoir construction.

Freddy thanked all participants for attending the meeting and urged them to forward their comments and also emphasise that the Draft Basic Assessment Report (BAR) will be available on the Maanakana Projects website.
